
## Picotee Amaryllis



## Hippeastrum 'Picotee'

- <u>Use:</u> The shapely blooms and rich, iridescent colors of Amaryllis light up a cold day like nothing else we know. They bring joy and wonder in the short days of winter.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun to part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant when established, but prefers moist soil, but must be well-drained.
- <u>Growth</u>: Stems grow 1-2 feet tall. The bulb will send out more stalks of flowers and grower larger over time. Too much water or low light can cause stems to elongate.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 7-10; Perennial; Herbaceous. (it is claimed that they are cold hardy down to zone 6) In zones 7 and below, we recommend deep planting (up to 4 inches of soil above the bulb) and a thick winter mulch.
- Foliage: Deciduous. Long, strap-like leaves.
- <u>Flower:</u> Crisp white petals, with edges finely penciled in rich red, present a clean, tailored look that's utterly distinctive. This choice variety is heavy blooming, unusual, and always in short supply. Allow 8–10 weeks from bulb to bloom
