## Pink Glory Amaryllis





The shapely blooms and rich, iridescent colors of Amaryllis light up a cold day like nothing else we know. Bulbs are preparedso they require only warm temperatures, attention to watering, and bright light to deliver a truly spectacular performance, a process that is great fun to watch.

## Hippeastrum 'Pink Glory'

- <u>Use:</u> Indulge yourself with these fully double, rose-pink blooms with darker veining and lighter pink edges. The shapely blooms and rich, iridescent colors of Amaryllis light up a cold day like nothing else we know. Each bulb averages 2 stems and a total of 8+ flowers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun to part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry, but allow soil to dry slightly in between watering. We don't recommend forcing them in straight water. Drought tolerant when established. Plant outdoors in late April in sandy soil and they will come back each year in zone 8.
- <u>Growth:</u> Grows 1-2' tall (higher light and not overwatering will help prevent stretching). The bulb will send out more stalks of flowers and grower larger over time.
- Hardiness: Zone 7-10 Perennial Herbaceous.
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Long, strap-like leaves.
- **Flower:** The pink and white striping on this blossoms surely lifts the spirits with its luxurious double petals. Blooms in 8-10 weeks from planting.
