Hyacinthus 'Apricot Passion'

- <u>Use:</u> Beautiful colored blooms complimented by a sweetly smelling scent make hyacinths a favorite choice for many gardeners. Spectacular when planted alone but hyacinths also feature well when planted in flower beds containing tulips and daffodils. A rather strong naturalizing bulb and missing from the menu for deer and rodents, hyacinth bulbs are easy to grow and care for. Long-lasting cut flower. Hyacinths are great for indoor forcing, containers, and borders.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full– part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant once established
- *Growth*: Grows 8-12" tall.
- Hardiness: Zone 4 –8 Bulb
- Foliage: Deciduous. Thick green leaves.
- <u>Flower:</u> A select hybrid in a new color—a light pastel apricot pink.
