

Chromacolor Daffodils



- **Planting density:** 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**

- **Use:** There is little to seek in a Daffodil that isn't found in 'Chromacolor'— substance, eye-catching beauty, and fragrance. Large-cupped Daffodils are the workhorses of the Daffodil world. They're good for bedding, picking, naturalizing, forcing, and showing. Large-cupped Daffodils always look fresh and festive. Narcissus blooms are for many gardeners the first visible signs of spring. Deer Resistant. Good cut flower. Daffodils are the most cost effective, pest-free perennial plants available and make wonderful companions with other bulbs, perennials, annuals and flowering shrubs.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established. As with all Pink Narcissi, it benefits from filtered sunlight so that it may develop its best pink coloration.
- **Growth:** Grows to a height of 16-18"
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Sturdy stems. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering. They will die back by summer end. It grows above its slender foliage, has a faint fragrance and is also good for warmer climates.
- **Flower:** The flower is clear white with a cup that turns deep reddish pink and has the scent of roses or raspberries.
