Cornish King Daffodils



- Planting density: 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.





Narcissus 'Dick Wilden'

- <u>Use:</u> We find Daffodils to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland garden. Perfect for naturalizing under trees, in the grassland, front borders, large pots and containers. We all like to see narcissus poking their heads through after a cold winter, and they are probably the most popular out of all Spring flowers. Deer Resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows 16-18" tall.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- Foliage: Deciduous. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering.
- <u>Flower</u>: Pale yellow petals mature to pristine white and offset the huge, bright yellow trumpet that flares out at the end in early to mid spring. Fantastic for cut flowers.
