

# Early Bride Daffodils



## *Narcissus 'Early Bride'*

- **Planting density: 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.**
- **Planting depth: 6 inches to base of the bulb.**
- **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**
- **Use:** Large-cupped Daffodils are ideal for mass plantings and naturalizing. This group has strong flowers and stems that withstand cold, wet, blustery spring weather. They boast large cups—some flaring wide, some trumpet-like, others ruffled. We find it to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden. Narcissus blooms are for many gardeners the first visible signs of spring. Deer Resistant. Good cut flower.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows 13" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering.
- **Flower:** A large daffodil with an orange trumpet that contrasts with its large white petals. This cup-shaped daffodil is suitable for naturalizing in grasses.
