

# Elka Daffodils



## ***Narcissus 'Elka' (Division1 /Trumpet)***

- **Planting density:** 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**
- **Use:** Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland garden. We find it to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden. Narcissus blooms are for many gardeners the first visible signs of spring. Deer & rabbit resistant. Good cut flower.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows 10" tall and 6" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Narrow, linear to strap-shaped, green leaves appear in erect to sprawling clumps. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering.
- **Flower:** A lovely little star-shaped white flower where the trumpet, which is a bit frilled, opens pale yellow and matures to white. Early season bloomer.
