

Isha Daffodils



- **Planting density: 6 inch apart, 6 per sq. ft.**
- **Planting depth: 8 inches to**

base of the bulb.

- **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**



Narcissus 'Isha'

- **Use:** Turn up the color in your spring garden with these double, brightly colored daffodils. Daffodils are extremely long lived, and almost entirely immune from disease and pests (including deer, which will not touch them). Of all flower bulbs, the one that lends itself most readily to naturalizing is the Narcissus.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established. Will naturalize over time. Fertilize after bloom in spring for the largest spring blooms the following year.
- **Growth:** Grows 14-16" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering. Requires minimum care. Allow the foliage to die back naturally. Lift dead foliage when it can be removed and these bulbs will return spring after spring.
- **Flower:** *These* daffodils make quite a statement with their fully double flowers. Each bloom opens in various vibrant shades of yellow, with a darker orange center. The "cup" portion of the flower is also double, giving the flower an even fuller appearance.
