

Loveday Daffodils



Narcissus 'Loveday'

- **Planting density: 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.**
- **Planting depth: 8 inches to base of the bulb.**
- **Best planted in a mass of 24 or more for dramatic effect.**
- **Use:** Large-cupped Daffodils are ideal for mass plantings and naturalizing. This group has strong flowers and stems that withstand cold, wet, blustery spring weather. They boast large cups—some flaring wide, some trumpet-like, others ruffled. We find it to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden. Narcissus blooms are for many gardeners the first visible signs of spring. Deer Resistant. Good cut flower.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows to a height of 16-20" and 6" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Sturdy stems. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering. They will die back by summer end.
- **Flower:** A 1985 Rosewarne cross of Scorpion and Amada, it has a substantive, 4"-wide beaming yellow perianth (outer petals) and a frilled, bowl-shaped cup in bright dark orange. Also called Orange Appeal, the cup's interior variably pales toward its apex.
