- Planting depth: 8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.

Narcissus 'Primeur'

- <u>Use:</u> Trumpet daffodil bulbs feature Giant flowers as large as the length of the flower petals (or larger). This group has the largest flower of any daffodil class. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland garden. It was selected for its distinctive color and the speed and ease with which it grows and multiplies. We find it to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
- *<u>Growth</u>:* Grows 16-18" tall.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- Foliage: Deciduous. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering. Allow foliage to dieback and send food reserves back into the bulb.
- *Flower:* One of the latest blooming Daffodil varieties. They have a beautiful golden color and combine well with tulips.
