Narcissus 'Queen's Day'

- **Planting density:** 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**
- **Use:** Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland garden. We find it to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden. Deer Resistant. Perfect for naturalizing under trees, in the grassland, front borders, large pots and containers. We all like to see narcissus poking their heads through after a cold winter, and they are probably the most popular out of all Spring flowers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows 16-18" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long, grass like foliage. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering.
- **Flower:** Each sumptuous blossom of Narcissus 'Queen's Day' forms a nest of folded sunny petaloids at the center of a series of stars-within-stars. Named to honor the Dutch national holiday, formerly known as Queen's Day. Early to midseason.
