

# Tahiti Daffodils



## *Narcissus 'Tahiti'*

- **Use:** 'Tahiti' stands up straight under its own weight, even on windy days. Its coloration is eye-catching, so it makes a big impact in the garden. Grow in borders and containers or try cutting a few stems to fill your house with a delicious spring scent. We find it to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden. Narcissus blooms are for many gardeners the first visible signs of spring. Deer Resistant. Good cut flower. Daffodils are the most cost effective, pest-free perennial plants available and make wonderful companions with other bulbs, perennials, annuals and flowering shrubs.
  - **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
  - **Growth:** Grows to a height of 12-24" and 6" wide.
  - **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
  - **Foliage:** Deciduous. Sturdy stems. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering. They will die back by summer end.
  - **Flower:** Has a soft-yellow flower with bright reddish-orange interior ruffles is reminiscent of a blossom from the tropics in late-mid spring.
- **Planting density:** 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
  - **Planting depth:** 8 inches to base of the bulb.
  - **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**



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
