

Thalia Daffodils



Narcissus 'Thalia'

- Lovely for creating a moon-light garden.
- Planting density: 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.



- **Use:** Blithe, snow-white Triandrus Narcissus Thalia has been a perennial favorite since 1916 when she was registered in the Netherlands. Narcissus blooms are for many gardeners the first visible signs of spring. Deer Resistant. Good cut flower. Daffodils are the most cost effective, pest-free perennial plants available and make wonderful companions with other bulbs, perennials, annuals and flowering shrubs.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows to a height of 12-15" and 6" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Sturdy stems. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering. They will die back by summer end.
- **Flower:** The fragrant flowers are the whitest of whites and are more out-facing than other Triandrus Daffodils. They are borne 2-3 per stem. This superb garden perennial shows up beautifully against ground covers such as Vinca. Heirloom, 1916. Late midseason.
