

Fragrant Watch Up Daffodils



Narcissus 'Watch Up' (Narcissus Class: Trumpet or Long Cupped Daffodils)

- **Use:** Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland garden. It was selected for its distinctive color and the speed and ease with which it grows and multiplies. We find it to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden. Registered in 2016, its substantive perianth is beautifully formed, and its long trumpet has a wavy, ribbed mouth and a luminous yellow-green eye.
 - **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
 - **Growth:** Grows 16-18" tall. 3-4" wide
 - **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8. Perennial. Bulb.
 - **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long thin leaves. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering.
 - **Flower:** Sweetly scented, this upward-facing beauty has a large, 4 1/2"-wide, greenish-white flower and a funnel-shaped trumpet that opens yellow and matures to white. Midspring bloomer.
- **Planting density:** 6 inch apart, 4-5 per sq. ft.
 - **Planting depth:** 6 –8 inches to base of the bulb.
 - **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**
