

Angelique Tulip



- **Planting density:** 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.

- **Planting depth:** ~8 inches to base of the bulb.

- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

- **Use:** Double Peony Tulips attract attention every time! Peony-flowering tulips are noted for their large double flowers that resemble old-fashioned peonies. You'll love the layers of delicate petals and incredible colors of these tulips. Stunning as cut flowers and as a delightful display tulip in the garden. Among the doubles are some of the most popular tulips today. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50.

Exposure/Soil: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.

- **Growth:** Grows 12-14" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap-like leaves.
- **Flower:** This exquisite semidouble bears 2–3 blooms on each stem, and the individual flowers are soft and slightly ruffled, with a full flush of the most delicate pale rose shades against a creamy white self. Late midseason.
