

# Apricona Tulip



- **Planting density:** 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

## *Tulipa 'Apricona' (Single Early type)*

- **Use:** This early-blooming, compact variety has full-size flowers on stems that are just 12-14" tall. Perfect for containers, smaller gardens and for tucking into the front of a perennial border. With Apricona's mélange of delicate hues that blend into an irresistible shade of pink, you'll want to bring as many inside as you can. Lovely planted with Grape Hyacinth/ Muscari.

**Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.

- **Growth:** Grows 12-14" tall. Short type.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap like green leaves.
- **Flower:** Large, rose-pink petals, bloom for a long period of time in early spring. When planted in larger quantities Apricona will produce the softest pink wave of color in early spring.
