

Tulip Foxtrot



- **Planting density:** 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

Tulipa 'Foxtrot'

- **Use:** Double Early Tulips, with their double row of petals, create a dazzling color display in the garden during late March and April. Growing only 10-12" tall on sturdy stems that will withstand April's showers, all Double Early Tulips are excellent for planting in beds, borders, or for forcing in pots indoors. Soft pink flowers with a darker pink undertone.

Exposure/Soil: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall. We recommend fertilization twice a year with bone meal fertilizer to improve their perennial nature.

- **Growth:** Grows 18-20" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap-like leaves.
- **Flower:** Double early variety with pink flowers, striped with white lines.
