

# Tulip Miranda



- **Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.**
- **Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.**
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

## *Tulipa 'Miranda'*

- **Use:** Double Peony Tulips attract attention every time! Peony-flowering tulips are noted for their large double flowers that resemble old-fashioned peonies. You'll love the layers of delicate petals and incredible colors of these tulips. Stunning as cut flowers and as a delightful display tulip in the garden. Among the doubles are some of the most popular tulips today. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 25" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap
- **Flower:** This brilliant red flower has a bit of yellow down in the center and zillions of petaloids. 'Miranda' is the fullest of the doubles and one of the most beautiful Tulips we've seen. Midseason. Their semidouble to double, peony-like flowers are long lasting.
