## Orange Marmalade Tulip



- Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 6-8 inches
  to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.

## Tulipa 'Orange Marmalade' (Viridiflora type)

• <u>Use:</u> This bold newcomer is deep melon-orange with prominent, thick green stripes that retain their coloration while in bloom. Stunning as cut flowers and as a delightful display tulip in the garden. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50.

**Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. They love sandy soil. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.

- **Growth**: Grows 16-18" tall.
- Hardiness: Zone 3-7b; Perennial Bulb
- Foliage: Deciduous. Long strap
- <u>Flower:</u> A stunning display of cup-shaped blooms, featuring a delightful blend of creamy orange and apricot hues that create a mesmerizing and inviting atmosphere. Late spring bloomer.
