Rodeo Drive Tulip



- Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.

Tulipa 'Rodeo Drive' (Triumph Tulip)

- <u>Use:</u> Stunning red tulip that is guaranteed to draw neighborhoods to your garden! Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. The large flowers of this variety look incredibly elegant sitting on top of their tall stems. Blooming in late April, Triumph Tulips are somewhat daintier than Darwin Hybrids with exquisite pastel-colored sheens. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 18-20" tall.
- Hardiness: Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- Foliage: Deciduous. Long strap like leaves.
- <u>Flower</u>: Rodeo Drive has one of the largest flowers ever on incredibly strong stems. It's just huge! Not only is it immense, but it has shapely, glowing, rich blood-red flowers with small yellow bases.
