Salmon Prince Tulip



- Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth:

 6-8 inches to
 base of the bulb.

 Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.



Tulipa 'Salmon Prince' (Single Early type)

- <u>Use:</u> Tulip Salmon Prince is classified as a Single Early Tulip which are the oldest Tulips in cultivation. Earlier blooming before any of the long-stemmed Tulips. Pair this type with white Hyacinths and Daffodils for a stunning show!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 14" tall.
- Hardiness: Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- Foliage: Deciduous. Long strap-like leaves.
- **Flower:** Sunset colors of soft pinks, peaches and creamy yellows. Early-mid spring bloomer. Beloved as a cut flower.
