Tulipa 'Yellow Pomponette' (Peony type)

- <u>Use:</u> Perfect for beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. The large flowers of this variety look incredibly elegant sitting on top of their tall stems. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50. <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- Growth: Grows 22" tall and 6" wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. Long strap like leaves with unique mottling..
- <u>Flower:</u> A late peony-flowered tulip with masses of lemonyellow flowers, it is a ray of sunshine, brightening up the garden in spring. Long-lasting blooms on sturdy stems.
- Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.
