## Brassica 'Early Dutch Flat'

- <u>Use</u>: Does well in southern and coastal areas because of its heat resistance. Excellent variety for sauerkraut and the best variety for storage. Heads are large and flat, weighing 6 to 10 lbs., averaging 11 in. diameter with medium core and few outside leaves. 85 days.
- Exposure/Soil: Full to part sun. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth**: Grows 12" tall and wide. Recommended spacing is 12 to 15 inches on rows at least three feet apart. You can also increase production in small garden by planting a double row on a bed.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Vegetable; Can be planted in spring, summer, or fall.
- <u>Foliage</u>: These compact heads are sweet for fabulous coleslaw, salad, or sauerkraut. Copenhagen Market became the standard of excellence for many store-bought varieties that were developed after it! Adaptable to a range of climates. Resists splitting and stores well.
- Flower: Not known for flowers.
