## Ruby Ball Cabbage





## Brassica oleracea var. capitat 'Ruby Ball'

- <u>Use</u>: Early-maturing, deep-red cabbage is sweet tasting and attractive.
   Firm, round head resists splitting, tolerates both cold and heat, holds in the field a long time and stores well after harvest. Excellent cooked or raw in salads. All-America Selections Winner
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. pH of 6.5-7 preferred so amend soil with lime.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows 12" tall and wide. Recommended spacing is 10 to 24 inches on rows 2-3' apart. You can also increase production in small garden by planting a double row on a bed.
- Hardiness: Vegetable; Can be planted in spring, summer, or fall.
- Foliage: The 3-4 lb. round heads are produced on upright plants and have a medium core. The compact plant allows for dense planting and produces heads of excellent quality that hold well at maturity. Early-maturing, deep-red cabbage is sweet tasting and attractive. Firm, round head resists splitting, tolerates both cold and heat. Excellent cooked or raw in salads. For cabbage worms and loopers, use Bacillus thuringiensis (Bt).
- Flower: Not known for flowers.
