

Bishop Cauliflower



Brassica oleracea 'Bishop'

An outstanding late-season variety that is surely worth the wait. It produces bright white heads that are heavy and have uniform dense curds. Bishops is ideal for sunny vegetable gardens or large container. Good for late spring or fall crops. Excellent vigor.

- **Use:** Bishop has well-wrapped heads, excellent vigor, and wide adaptability. Improved Fremont-type hybrid. Bishop produces bright white heads, consistently dense curds, excellent weight, and an exceptional "Hershey kiss" style internal wrap.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun. Prefers moist, but not wet soils. Transplant into soil rich in humus or compost that has been adjusted to a pH of 6.5-7.
- **Growth:** Space plants 6-8" inches apart in the row, and space rows three feet apart. The heads average 4-6" across. 68 days from setting out transplants in the garden.
- **Hardiness:** A cool-weather crop, it can be grown in spring and fall everywhere, and even in winter in mild-weather areas. We recommend using a frost cloth to protect from hard freezes.
- **Foliage:** Not typically eaten.
- **Flower:** Impressive, high quality, 7" heads. The heads are delicious whether cut up raw in salads, quickly steamed, or tossed with olive oil and roasted to nutty perfection.
