

Symphony Cauliflower



Cauliflower Tip

Harvest cauliflower when the curd is 4 to 6 inches across, and trim the leaves.

Brassica oleracea ‘Symphony’

- **Use:** Great for the fall. A late season hybrid for summer and fall harvests. Large upright, vigorous plants have excellent self-blanching capabilities which allow for a short banding period. Dense, deep heads are well protected by tight inner wrapper leaves. Excellent for fresh market and fresh processing. Maturity in about 70 - 75 days from transplanting.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun. Prefers moist, but not wet soils.
- **Growth:** Space plants 6-8" inches apart in the row, and space rows three feet apart. The heads average 4-6" across.
- **Hardiness:** A cool-weather crop, it can be grown in spring and fall everywhere, and even in winter in mild-weather areas. We recommend using a frost cloth to protect from hard freezes.
- **Foliage:** Not typically eaten.
- **Flower:** Acclaimed for whiteness; Erect plant habit with excellent inner wrapper leaves.
