Kale is well known as an edible foliage, but for a novelty item take a peek at these bedding and cut flower types! Used extensively in cooler seasons, they add color and texture to arrangements and beds. Tall cut flower types can be spaced close together for high density production in field, greenhouse or high tunnel. Inner leaves start to color up when night temperatures fall below 55°F.



Brassica oleracea 'Yokohma Series'

- <u>Use:</u> Yokohama features very unique, extra-curly fringed leaves that form nicely mounded plants. Yokohama looks great planted alone, in garden beds or in mixed containers. This outstanding series also offers improved cold tolerance. Plants fit perfectly into containers large and small. Slow to bolt longer and stronger performance in the garden. Looks beautiful planted with
- pansies, parsley, snapdragons, and dusty miller in the winter garden.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Plant in full sun. Prefers moist, but not wet soils. If you don't have good drainage they will rot.
- Growth: Grows 5-7" tall and 8" wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-8; Annual; Lasts all winter, does not like heat.
 - **Foliage:** Evergreen in winter; Fringed leaves of Yokohama are extra curly, presenting an attractive unique look to these compact plants. While the center of the leaves turn color under cooler temperatures, the outer edges remain a medium to dark green.
- Flower: Tall stalks of sulfur yellow flowers in spring.
