

# California Wonder Sweet Pepper

***Capsicum annuum 'California Wonder' (65 to 70 days from sow)***

- **Use:** HEIRLOOM. The standard bell pepper for many decades, this 1928 introduction is still the largest open-pollinated, heirloom bell you can grow, and it's a vast over the earlier bells. A perfect stuffing pepper—blocky 4" x 3½", thick-walled, tender and flavorful.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun or at least 5-6 hours of afternoon sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Keep water off leaves and flowers.
- **Growth:** Plants are 24-36" tall and multibranching.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 9-11, Annual,
- **Foliage:** The short fuzzy leaves are unique and distinctive as well.
- **Flower:** These peppers are thick-walled and blocky, about 4 inches tall and wide, with a crisp, mild flavor and terrific sweetness. They mature from green to red on the plant, and are ideal for stuffing, slicing into rings for dips and salad toppings, and chopping into crisp bite-sized nibbles. Expect a big harvest from these vigorous plants, which reach 28 to 30 inches high.
