- <u>Use:</u> You will love Murcott Honey Mandarins for their sweet, refreshing juice. These mandarins are known for their abundance of fresh, colorful juice. Biting into one of these mandarins, you'll get a mouth full of the sweetest citrus juice you've ever had.
- tt <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full sun. These citrus trees require moist well drained, but not wet, soil, and should be watered deeply, but not frequently. The soil pH should be neutral. With regular fertilizing, you can have your first harvest this year. Citrus are heavy feeders.
 - **Growth**: Moderate growing 6 to 8 ft. tall, 2-3 ft. wide in containers. Could grow 10-15' in ground.
 - <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 8/9-11; Must be grown indoors in winter for reliable fruit production when nites are below 50 degrees.
 - *Foliage*: Evergreen, glossy green, fragrant foliage if brought indoors in winter.
 - *Flower:* Fragrant 1" white flowers, We love the fragrance of the blossoms!
 - <u>Fruit</u>: A popular citrus prized for it's sweet and rich flavor with a hint of tanginess. Easy to peel fruit a great for snacking and making fresh juice. Produeces the most fruit winter to early spring.
