

# Black Cherry Tomato



Beautiful black cherries look like large, dusky purple-brown grapes; they have that rich flavor that makes black tomatoes famous. Large vines yield very well; very unique and delicious

- ***Lycopersicum 'Black Cherry'***
- **Use:** An heirloom too rarely encountered, this delectable variety fully merits a place in the garden and on the dinner table. Yields plentiful clusters of perfectly round 1" true cherry tomatoes that are deep red with a blackish hue. The flavor? Complex, rich, juicy and sweet. Indeterminate. Harvest about 75 days from transplant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** FULL SUN! Soak soil to depth of 6 to 10 inches when watering. They need at least 6 hours of direct sunlight a day. Tomatoes hate red clay so use a good soil such with a peat mix.
- **Growth:** Grows 42-48" tall and 42-48" wide. Plant tomatoes 2"-3" deeper than current soil line for a sturdy plant.
- **Hardiness:** 9-11, Annual, Vegetable
- **Foliage:** Evergreen if indoors; Small, lacy, fragrant leaves.
- **Fruit:** Beautiful shadings of olive and rust, produces enormous plants which sprawl without staking, producing an enormous quantity of fruits. Flavor heavy, full, good in salads..
