## Sugar Rush Tomato



Get ready for big yields and great eating from Sugar Rush Hybrid!



## Lycopersicum 'Sugar Rush' (53 days from setting out transplants)

- <u>Use</u>: Children aren't the only ones who will love these ultra-sweet, dewdrop-shaped grape tomatoes! The flavor is spectacular -- a good mix of meatiness and ultra-crunchy sweetness -- and the plate appeal irresistible!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full sun or at least 5-6 hours of afternoon sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Keep water off leaves and flowers.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows quickly 3 ' tall. Plant 3' apart in rows(4' wide). You'll definitely want to stake or cage these vigorous climbers to keep the fruit off the ground and avoid pests and diseases.
- *Hardiness:* 9-11, Annual, Houseplant.
- Foliage: Small, lacy leaves.
- **Fruit:** Though classified as a grape tomato, Sugar Rush actually looks like a cherry and grape combination, with plump, rounded fruit in long, elegant trusses all over very vigorous plants. It is indeterminate, so it keeps going all season long, but the plant is more stocky than vining, reaching 5 to 7 feet high and perhaps 3 to 4 feet wide. You will be astonished at its productivity over a long summer!
