

Sunsugar Tomato



Lycopersicum 'Sunsugar'

- **Use:** Vigorous, indeterminate plant bears long clusters of crack-resistant orange fruit with "rich, full-bodied flavor," as one panelist noted in voting it the best Cherry Tomato on the market (Sunset magazine) 62 days from transplanting seedling to reaching maturity.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun or at least 5-6 hours of afternoon sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Keep water off leaves and flowers.
- **Growth:** Grows quickly 3' tall. Plant 3' apart in rows (4' wide). You'll definitely want to stake or cage these vigorous climbers to keep the fruit off the ground and avoid pests and diseases.
- **Hardiness:** 9-11, Annual, Houseplant.
- **Foliage:** Small, lacy leaves.
- **Fruit:** The ultimate cherry tomato, very sweet, yet capturing tangy true tomato flavor. The deep golden-yellow, 1/2 ounce fruits are very crack resistant which is quite remarkable considering their very thin skin. Vigorous, indeterminate plants set fruit early and in huge quantities.
