

Dwarf Pomegranate Bush



Bright coral-red flowers and fruit make a striking houseplant. Perfect for outdoors, too. Funnel-shaped flowers attract hummingbirds! Fruit is great in salads; makes a juicy snack.



Punica grantum 'Nana'

- **Use:** Showy, dense dwarf shrub displays attractive orange-red single flowers at an early age, followed by colorful fruit. Excellent for containers or for use in the garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. Soil should be well-drained. Acidic soil is preferred, though it can tolerate a wide variety of soils. As long as it is properly established, it is moderately drought tolerant.
- **Growth:** Moderate, 3' tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-11; Tree/ Small shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Small green leaves.
- **Flower:** Showy red blossoms attract hummingbirds and then turn into small fruits in late summer/ early fall. While the fruit is edible it lacks both the size and sweet flavor offered by the standard pomegranate. Please google "UGA Pomegranate" for an excellent article on care. Self fruitful.
