

Arp Rosemary



As an herb, Rosemary is used to flavor meat dishes, and condiments.

Rosemarinus officinalis 'Arp'

- **Use:** More cold-hardy than most, it quickly forms an upright hedge of aromatic needle-like foliage that has a very good flavor for culinary use. Profuse clear-blue flowers provide additional landscape value. Well-suited to regular pruning for small topiaries.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun; well-draining soil and appreciates slow release fertilizer. Must have good drainage as it can't stand soggy feet.
- Water regularly when top 3in of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Perhaps the hardiest of all varieties, it will reach 36" to 48" and widths of 18" to 24"
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-10; Shrub /herb
- **Foliage:** Evergreen.
- **Flowers:** The small blue flowers that appear in mid summer are edible as well, and make a nice garnish for salads.
