Heritage Red Raspberry



Rubus idaeus 'Heritage'

- <u>Use</u>: Everbearing raspberry for fall bearing with great color, flavor, firmness and freezing quality. Fruit are large in size, dark red, and very sweet.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: This cultivar prefers sun and well-drained, moderately fertile soil, but unlike most other red raspberries does not require a cold winter and gradual spring to produce good fruit. Partial shade and a cool mulch may be beneficial.
- **<u>Growth</u>**: Rapid growth to 4-6' tall and wide. Upright and vigorous growth.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: 5-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; In spring and summer, the leaves are shiny dark green above and gray-green below, turning to burgundy in fall and winter.
- *Flowers:* The glossy red fruits are good for eating fresh and freezing.
- <u>Pruning:</u> They produce fruit on primocanes (first-year canes). Canes emerge from the ground in early spring, grow to 3 to 4 feet tall, and form flower clusters in the terminals of the canes. Once the terminals flower, flower clusters are produced one at a time progressively back down the canes. The first fruits of Redwing to ripen are generally ready for harvest in Athens about July 15. Harvest continues until a killing freeze.
