

Pink Chintz Thyme



Thymus 'Pink Chintz'

- **Use:** Low trailing, fragrant evergreen perennial makes a beautiful small scale ground cover or low border. A tight, low growing creeping thyme with thick stems of woolly green foliage that blooms in mid-spring with a profusion of salmon-pink flowers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Tolerates full sun to part shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry to start. Little water needed once established. Good drainage is key, red clay must be amended with sand and fine rock for best results. No standing water.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower 1" tall(2-3" tall in bloom) x 10" wide and continues to spread by underground shoots.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9, Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. With its thick stems of woolly foliage is more durable and more waterwise than other creeping thymes and thrives in almost any well-drained soil in full sun. Can tolerate occasional foot traffic.
- **Flower:** Tiny pink flowers appear in early spring.

It is one of the first Thyme to bloom in spring and is an excellent choice for planting between flagstones and other stone pavers in patios, courtyards, and pathways.
