Vaccinium x 'Pink Lemonade'

- **Use:** Pinkish-white flowers produce pale greenish fruit that ripens to an astonishing deep pink color. All the anti-oxidants of its blue cousins but in an incredible new color. In the Fall, the leaves turn golden-yellow to brilliant-orange. Pleasant flavored, glossy fruit that ripens in mid-late season. High-bush variety.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers light, acid soils (pH 4.5-5.2) with high organic matter (20-50%) are preferred, unlike most fruit crops.
- **Growth:** *Moderate grower to 4-5 ft. tall and 5 ft. wide.*
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; shrub
- **Pollination:** *Although blueberries are self-fertile, cross-pollination produces the best fruit crop (larger berries and larger yields). Therefore, it is best to plant more than one variety that will bloom at the same time.*
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Bluish-green foliage.
- **Flower:** In the spring it has pinkish white, bell-shaped flowers that form pale green berries that slowly turn pale pink and when fully ripe are a bright pink. The bushes produce a larger first crop in mid to late summer and a smaller crop continuously until about October. ***More info from UGA on our website on the PLANT INFORMATION PAGE.***
