Vaccinium ashei 'Krewer'

- **Use:** Watch out Titan – here comes Krewer Blueberry! A companion plant to the Titan, Krewer has very large, sweet blueberries. If you're looking for bragging rights get the Krewer and Titan. Krewer is a great choice for homeowners and U-Picks. Released in late 2014 by the University of Georgia (UGA), Krewer was named in honor of UGA's pioneer blueberry grower and retiree, Dr. Gerard Krewer. Ripens in late May to early June. 400 chill hours.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers light, acid soils (pH 4.5-5.2) with high organic matter (20-50%) are preferred, unlike most fruit crops.
- **Growth:** Moderate, 4-10' tall and wide; best if pruned.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; shrub
- **Pollination:** Plant more than one variety for cross-pollination to promote adequate fruit set. Also, choosing varieties from the different ripening categories provides a broad harvest season.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Bluish-green foliage.
- **Flower:** It has the largest fruit ever seen at the University of Georgia Rabbiteye breeding program! Firm, light blue berries are much better flavored than older varieties. Shelf life after harvest is outstanding. Ripens mid-late season, resistant to stem canker. The "latest and greatest" from University of Georgia!
