- <u>Use:</u> Huge Amounts of Fruit from a Small Container Plant. Bushel and Berry<sup>™</sup> Peach Sorbet<sup>™</sup> Blueberry Bush is a 2013 introduction and it is one of the most acclaimed fruiting shrubs we carry. Unlike traditional blueberry bushes which grow tall, leggy, and need to be staked these grow into a compact shrub.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Prefers light, acid soils (pH 4.5-5.2) with high organic matter (20-50%) are preferred, unlike most fruit crops.
- Growth: Reaches 1 1/2 to 2 ft. tall and wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 6-9; shrub
- Pollination: Although blueberries are self-fertile, cross-pollination produces the best fruit crop (larger berries and larger yields).

  Therefore, it is best to plant more than one variety that will bloom at the same time.
- <u>Foliage:</u> Deciduous. stunning peach, pink, orange and emerald green leaves.
- <u>Flower:</u> White bell-shaped flowers appear in spring, leading to an abundant summer crop of blueberries. In most climates, this plant will keep its leaves throughout winter and turns a rich eggplant purple.
