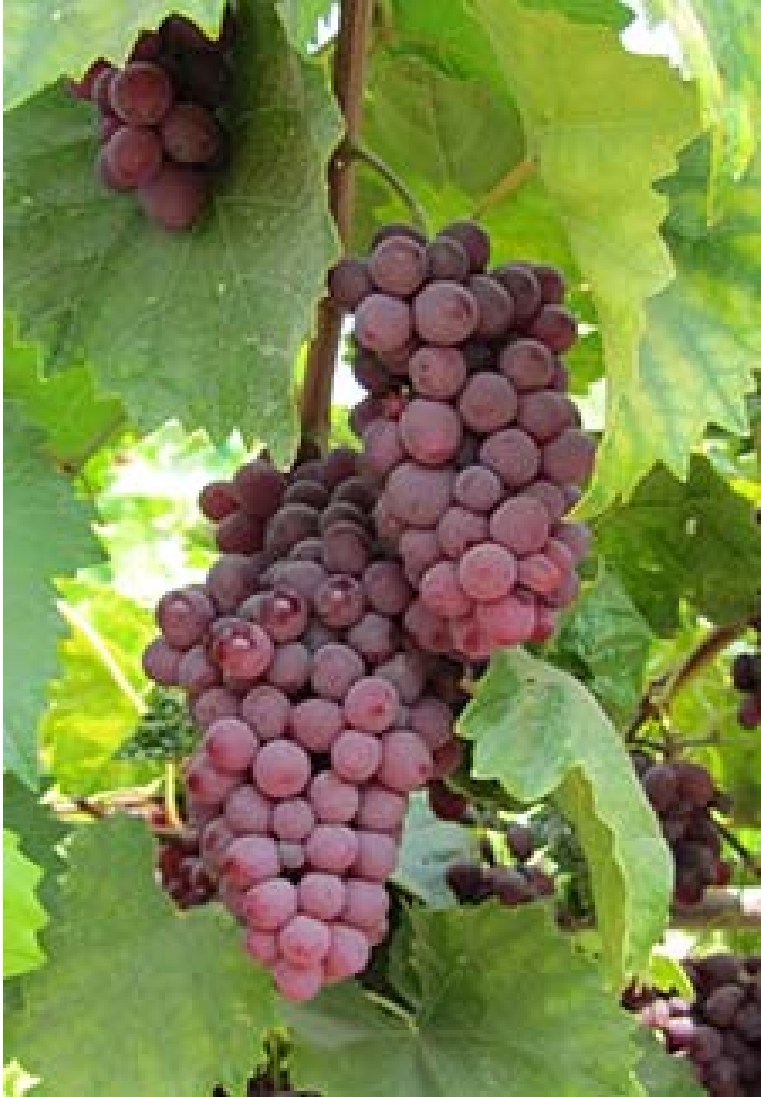


# Razzmatazz Grapes



Combining the sweet flavor and tender-crisp texture of table grapes with the disease resistance and native hardiness of muscadines, RazzMatazz is the first seedless grape to provide gardeners with true fruiting success without spraying.

## *Vitis 'Razzmatazz'*

- **Use:** *RazzMatazz* represents a breakthrough in breeding by hybridizer Jeff Bloodworth from NC. This cross takes the humble Muscadine with its native vigor and disease resistance to a new level in consumer appreciation. - **Exposure/Soil:** This grape tolerates a wide range of soil conditions, but must have good drainage. Prefers warm Southern sun exposure for best crop. Needs full sunlight and high temperatures to ripen, so plant on southern slopes, the south side of windbreaks, or the south sides of buildings.
- **Growth:** **Versatile and fast growing to 8', a grapevine can bear in just 2 years.**
- **Hardiness:** **Zone 7-9;** Vine ; Very cold hardy cultivar.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green above and green tinged yellow beneath, the leaves are glossy on both sides, becoming firm and subglabrous at maturity.
- **Flower:** It colors to an iridescent pinkish red starting in August but the flavor has not developed at this point. It is fully ripe in early September when the fruit is a deep dark red. The extended cropping allows the gardener fruit all the way till the first frost. Self pollinating.

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
