

# Noble Muscadine



Wineries throughout Georgia, North Carolina and Tennessee use this variety to make quality red muscadine wine.

## *Vitis rotundifolia* 'Noble'

- **Use:** A black self-fertile variety that produces medium size fruit with good quality and large clusters. This muscadine variety is the standard for making red wine. The muscadine vine is very vigorous, cold hardy and disease resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun. Muscadine grapes grow well on a wide range of soils but best results are obtained from well-drained sandy loams with a pH of 5.5 to 6.5. They will not tolerate low, wet ground.
- **Growth:** Plant in full sun at 15-20 ft. apart on strong trellises.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-10; Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green above and green tinged yellow beneath, the leaves are glossy on both sides, becoming firm and subglabrous at maturity.
- **Flower:** The Noble muscadine has very high yields. Ripens mid-season. 16% sugar. **[Print out more information from our Plant Info page on our website.](#)**
