

Zebra Vine Basket



Aeschynanthus marmoratus

- **Use:** Wow! This little vine is stunning! Aeschynanthus is a beautiful small hanging houseplant with stunning, glossy green, oval-shaped leaves that have wonderful purple colored variegation on the underside. Zebra vine care is easy - making this an ideal houseplant. A beginner friendly houseplant that is often overlooked and underrated. Anyone looking for something a bit odd or for that special novelty gift to give their plant enthusiast friend or lover a chuckle look no further. One of the easier houseplants to look after and care for, letting you get away with only occasional attention. Naturally grows as an epiphyte on trees.

- **Exposure/Soil:**

Light: The plant prefers bright, indirect light. Direct sunlight can scorch the leaves, while too little light can hinder blooming. A spot near an east or north-facing window is ideal.

Watering: Consistent moisture is crucial, but the plant should not be left in standing water. Water thoroughly when the top inch of soil feels dry, and ensure good drainage to prevent root rot.

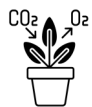
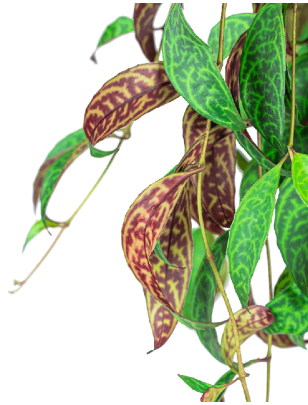
Humidity: As a tropical plant, it thrives in high humidity. Regular misting, a humidity tray, or a room humidifier can help maintain the necessary moisture levels.

Temperature: The plant prefers temperatures between 65°F and 80°F (18°C to 27°C). It should be protected from drafts and sudden temperature changes.

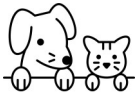
Soil: A well-draining potting mix rich in organic matter is ideal. A mix designed for African violets or a blend of peat, perlite, and orchid bark works well.

Fertilization: During the growing season (spring and summer), feed the plant with a balanced liquid fertilizer every two weeks. Reduce feeding during the fall and winter when growth slows down.

- **Growth:** Grows in a vine-like manner, with long, trailing stems that can reach up to 3 feet in length
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-12, Annual, Houseplant; Needs above 60 degrees indoors.
- **Foliage:** Dark green leaves with white veins that resemble zebra stripes. Purple undersides.
- **Flower:** Flowers are not very showy on this species and will only occur in high light conditions. Foliage is more exciting.
