

Anthurium



Very easy to grow houseplant or annual to put in your shade planters in warmer months. Adds a tropical flair to your home.

Anthurium sp.

- **Use:** With the bright waxy tough flowers hovering above the contrasting dark green leaves for months on end they certainly have many fans.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Bright light or nearly full sun (not direct or scorching sunshine) is best to maintain strong foliage coloration and vigorous growth indoors. Make sure you don't have chlorine in your water or use filtered water. Prefers high humidity and high temperatures as well. Indoors, mist several times a week to provide added humidity or place in the shower once a month.
- **Growth:** Can grow 3' tall and 3' wide over time.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-11 Houseplant, Annual. Bring inside in winter when temps go below 50 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Waxy, heart-shaped-spadelike leaves. Washing foliage down every so often in the shower will keep them clean.
- **Flower:** Produces a spathe with a sharp contrasting white spadix. Mature plants produce multiple blooms held well above the foliage. The flowers are long lasting and it's not unusual for an Anthurium to be in almost continuous flower.
