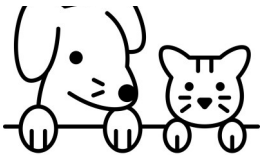


Neanthe Bella Palm



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

- **Use:** Neanthe Bella Palm, or Parlor Palm, is indigenous to the rainforests of Southern Mexico and Guatemala. Known for its air-purifying abilities and durability, the Bella Palm is one of the most widely sold houseplant palms in the world. Neanthe Bella is known for an attractive appearance that features light green fronds with a delicate texture that grow to about eight inches long.
- **Exposure/Soil:** They adapt to lower light, but they thrive in indirect, bright light. Try to avoid too much direct sunlight on your Bella Palm, as prolonged direct sunlight can scorch and burn your plant's leaves. Your plant will adapt to lower light conditions, but you will notice a deepening of its color if it remains in lower light for a prolonged period. prefer slightly moist soil, with a slight period of drought between waterings. Water when the top 1-2 inches of soil are dry, or approximately every 7-10 days. Always check the soil before watering, as each palm is different and many other factors, such as where you live, or the size of your palm's pot could affect how quickly its soil dries between waterings. Overwatering can result in root rot, while underwatering can lead to crispy, dry leaves. These plants are light feeders, meaning you should go light on the fertilizer. Use a couple of teaspoons of a slow release 8-2-12 palm fertilizer in early spring. Do not allow the fertilizer to come in contact with the leaves when mixing it into the soil as this can burn them.
- **Growth:** Smaller in stature than an outdoor palm, the indoor Bella Palm usually does not grow beyond 6 feet tall max, with most staying under 3 feet, meaning there is plenty of space in your collection for one.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-11; Houseplant; Tropical, While Bella Palms can survive at lower temperatures, for your plant to grow, temperatures should stay warm, between 65°F and 80°F. Cooler temperatures will slow or stop your plant's growth. Prolonged exposure to temperatures below 50°F or frost will kill your Bella Palm, so make sure you keep it in a spot at home that's secure from drafts and sudden drops in temperature. If your palm begins to develop dry spots on its leaves, it's most likely the result of exposure to lower temperatures or prolonged dryness; misting your palm and increasing the humidity can help to rectify dry spots.
- **Foliage:** Features light green fronds with a delicate texture that grow to about eight inches long.
- **Flowers:** Bright orange inflorescence.
