


Ellen Danica Oak Leaf Ivy



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

Hang on a shady porch, indoors or outdoors. Or create an elegant shade window box with this showy ivy in warmer months.

Cissus rhombifolia 'Ellen Danica'

- **Use:** A popular, fast-growing evergreen trailing houseplant with distinctively lobed, glossy green leaves. As a hardy, easy-care vine, it thrives in bright, indirect light, prefers moist soil, and is ideal for hanging baskets or climbing trellises. Really transforms a space by adding different textures and shapes.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Thrives in medium to bright direct light; avoid placing it in low-light areas. Known for its adaptability and ease of care, thriving in medium to bright indirect light and preferring well-draining soil. Regular watering to keep the soil evenly moist and occasional feeding will enhance its growth and vigor. Water the plant thoroughly and allow the water to drain through. Never let the plant stand in water as this will cause root rot. Set potted *Cissus* on a bed of pebbles with water (not touching the base of the pot) to humidify the air around it.
- **Growth:** Known for their rapid growth, often extending 1–2 feet per month in optimal conditions. They typically reach maturity within 6–12 months, developing into dense, trailing, or climbing vines that can reach up to 10–20 feet in length. Prune back occasionally as needed for a tidy plant.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-11, Houseplant
- **Foliage:** This variety features shiny, dark-green, rhombic-shaped leaves with distinct toothed edges, resembling the shape of oak leaves.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers. Insignificant greenish flowers may appear in summer followed by dark berries.
