Arabian Coffee Plant





This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.

Coffea arabica

- <u>Use</u>: Join the coffee craze and grow your own coffee beans! Arabica is the coffee of commerce and produces red, pulpy berries on an upright shrub. And if the berries don't attract enough attention, then the fragrant white blooms nestled among shiny green leaves surely will. We also like to use Coffee as a fragrant foliage plant to fill a room. Place in a bright window and soon you'll be harvesting your own coffee beans.
- Exposure/Soil: Performs best in bright, indirect light. Repot in our special potting mix. The soil and the pot choose need to drain well to keep your plant happy. Choose a container only a couple inches wider than the pot your plant comes in. Enjoys humidity so if your home is very dry, mist the leaves daily. Keep the soil slightly moist. Do not allow your plant to be waterlogged or completely day. Watering your plant about twice per week is best in most homes. Apply our slow release fertilizer when planting and twice per year if your plant is in the ground. In a pot, fertilize 3-4 times per year for ideal fruit production and growth. Pick the coffee fruit when they are bright red over the whole cherry.
- **Growth:** Can grow 3-5' tall and wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 10-11 Houseplant, Annual
- Foliage: Handsome dark green leaves standing erect from short stems.
- **Flower:** White, jasmine scented flowers blanket your plant before becoming coffee cherries which are the fruit of the coffee plant. Each cherry produces 2 coffee bean and your plant can produce hundreds of cherries. The coffee fruit start out green and transition to red as they ripen over 9 months. Self pollinating.
