

Florica Hawaiian Ti Plant



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.

Very easy to grow house-plant or annual to put in your shade planters. Adds a tropical flair to your home.

Cordyline fruticose 'Florica'

- **Use:** Ti plant is a bold houseplant with flamboyantly colored foliage. Also called cordyline, cabbage palm, or good luck plant, it's a perfect choice for adding a dash of style and drama to any well-lit room in your home. Most ti plant varieties have purple foliage variegated with streaks of hot pink, cream, white, or other shades of purple. The leaves add more color than many flowering houseplants -- and they're attractive all year long. ***Ti plant is often being associated with good luck. In some areas of the tropics (it's a landscape shrub in frost-free areas) the plant is grown outside of outside of houses to bring good fortune and ward off ghosts or evil spirits.***
- **Exposure/Soil:** Bright light or nearly full sun (not direct or scorching sunshine) is best to maintain strong foliage coloration and vigorous growth indoors. Tolerates low-light to shade, but leaf variegation can be affected and become a tad dull due to reduction in light intensity. Make sure you don't have chlorine in your water or use filtered water. Prefers high humidity and high temperatures as well. Indoors, mist several times a week to provide added humidity or place in the shower once a month to prevent insect issues and dusty plants.
- **Growth:** Can grow 3' tall and 3' wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 9-11 Houseplant, Annual. Bring inside in winter.
- **Foliage:** Features pink-and-red splashed green leaves.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers, accentuated by periodic sprays of small, purple star-shaped flowers.

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
