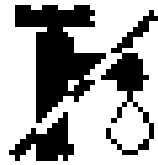


String of Teardrops



This rare succulent is a great addition to your collection! In the fall, watch for white blossoms that smell like cinnamon.



Senecio(Curio) citrifolius

- **Use:** A trailing succulent with plump, lemon- or teardrop-shaped blue-green leaves dusted in a fine waxy bloom and marked with faint translucent lines. Slower and tidier than string of bananas, it spills gently from hanging pots and needs bright light, well draining soil and little watering.
- **Exposure/Soil:** To prevent rot, use well-draining pots and soil and only water when the soil is dry. Keep the soil even drier during winter dormancy. To grow a lush plant, regularly prune the stems and replant the cuttings back in the same pot. Make sure that all parts of the trailing mass get sunlight and, if possible, move the plant outdoors to a covered porch or patio each summer.
- **Growth:** Grows 12"-24" and trails down. Spreads more over time, but not invasive.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10-11; Houseplant/ Annual Bring indoors when temps below 60.
- **Foliage:** Evergreen if kept indoors. Trailing succulent foliage featuring plump, teardrop-shaped green leaves marked with translucent longitudinal lines.
- **Flower:** If properly cared for, it can send up bloom stalks with pom-pom-like clusters of tiny creamy-yellow, pale yellow, or white on 6" stalks in late summer to winter. Known to produce a pleasant, sweet, and spicy odor often compared to cinnamon.
