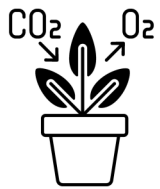
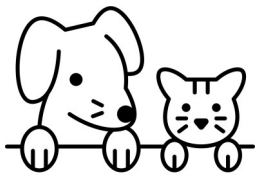


White Rabbit's Foot Fern



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.



This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

- **Use:** Their fuzzy creeping stems inspire several of these ferns' common names -- Deer's, Rabbit's and Squirrel's Foot Ferns. Best used in hanging baskets where their little "feet" curl over the edges. In nature, these stems or rhizomes attach themselves to tree trunks. Requiring less water than other ferns do.
- **Exposure/Soil: Part sun-shade.** Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Ferns love humidity. Just be sure to water in the mornings if possible. Water under the leaves as they hate being watered in the center of the plant.
- **Growth:** Will continue to grow in the basket, but not very fast to about 12-24" tall.
- **Hardiness: Zone 10-11, Annual, Houseplant,** Bring inside in winter and keep above 50 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Lacy fronds of deep green.
- **Flower:** No flowers.
