

Lemon Lime Draceana



Dracaena 'Lemon Lime'

- **Use:** The Dracaena Lemon Lime stands out among its genus for its name-sake neon yellow and green striped leaves, but much like the rest of its family its care is relatively straightforward. Capable of reaching heights of 5-7 feet indoors, it can also be kept to a tabletop size with regular pruning.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Medium to bright indirect light. Too much direct sun will scorch and pale the leaves, while very dim light can cause leggy growth and browning. If your windows face South or West, be sure to place the plant behind sheer curtains or far enough removed from the window that the plant is out of the direct stream of light. Allow to dry between waterings. Don't over-water.
- **Growth:** A fast-growing plant that reaches heights of 8 to 12 feet at maturity.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 10b-11 Houseplant /Tropical Will not tolerate below 50 degrees at nite.
- **Foliage:** Lemon Lime takes its name from the bright yellow and green variegation of its sword-like leaves. Rotate your plant periodically to ensure even growth on all sides and dust the leaves often so the plant can photosynthesize efficiently. When dusting the leaves, also take the opportunity to inspect the undersides and keep an eye out for pests.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.
